ABSTRACT

Keywords: Figurative Language, Moral Message, The Railway Children.

Figurative language encompasses the use of words or expressions that deviate from their literal meanings to convey more complex, vivid, and imaginative ideas. Moral messages are the ethical lessons or principles communicated through narrative elements, reflecting societal values and encouraging reflective thought. The objectives of this research are to explore the figurative languages used by E. Nesbit in novel "The Railway Children", and to investigate the moral message of the novel.

The research employs a qualitative content analysis methodology, using content analysis approach. Based on the theory of figurative language from Keraf (1981), the study scrutinizes Nesbit's stylistic techniques and their contributions to narrative richness and ethical instruction in the novel.

The findings of this study reveal that "The Railway Children" incorporates eight types of figurative languages, including similes, metaphors, and personifications, which significantly enhance the narrative's vividness and emotional resonance. Additionally, the novel conveys multiple moral messages, emphasizing themes such as family solidarity, resilience, and compassion, thereby affirming its pedagogical value and sustained relevance in literary studies.
