ABSTRACT

In the process of students writing a narrative, guidance and feedback from the teacher are crucial to build a good piece of writing. the goal of feedback is not only to assess the extent of a student's ability in writing narrative texts. But also, to provide motivation for them to improve their narrative writing skills in the future. This study aimed to analyse the teachers' strategies in providing feedback, identify the impact of teachers' feedback, and explore student's response on their writing.

This research using descriptive qualitative method, the subject of this research was one teacher and tenth student of X-A of MA Syekh Subakir Nglegok Blitar. Data of this study was collected through observation, interviews, and documentation technique. To analyse the data, the researcher used Miles and Huberman theory, which includes data reduction, data display, and data conclusion.

From the analysis, the researcher found teacher practiced two strategies to provide feedback on students' writing, i.e., direct corrective feedback, and indirect corrective feedback. In implementing both strategies, teachers also often use technology as a support in providing feedback. Students' responses to corrective feedback from teachers vary and included: pay attention, accepting, being motivated, appreciating, and not following up. Last, the feedback provided by the teachers is considered effective as it can increase student awareness of error in their written text. Additionally, students become more confident due to the continuous improvement of their writing skill and are able to independently analyse their written text with increased language accuracy.
