Each teaching-learning activity, regardless of the material always has the object or involvement, the object in the learning process that is a teacher and students.<sup>1</sup> Teaching is guiding and facilitating learning<sup>2</sup>. Most of people think of teaching as the overt presentations of information by teacher to learner. Teaching used to refer to anything done by materials developers or teacher to facilitate the learning.

Anne Sullivan was a teacher who taught Helen Keller, a blind and deaf child, how to communicate and read Braille. Born on April 14, 1866, in Feeding Hills, Massachusetts, Anne Sullivan was a gifted teacher best known for her work with Helen Keller, a blind and deaf child she taught to communicate. At only 20 years of age, Sullivan showed great maturity and ingenuity in teaching Keller and worked hard with her pupil, bringing both

women much acclaim. Sullivan even helped Keller write her autobiography.

3. Children with special needs

Children with special need are children who have mild learning disabilities or profound mental retardation, terminal illness, developmental delas that cats up quicly or remain entrenched; occasional panic attacks or serious psychiatric problem.<sup>8</sup>

4. The Miracle Worker

The Miracle Worker movie by Nadia Tass in 2000 had won three nominations. First, the film had won a Family television award in 2001. Second, the film had won the Golden Reel Award nominations as a best motion picture sound editors USA in 2001. And the third, the film had won nominations young artist awards as best performance in a TV movie young actress age ten or under, played by Hallie Kate Eisenberg (Helen Keller).
