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
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

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ABSTRACT

Vocabulary is the main element of language skill and gives much of the primary for how good learners speak, listen, read, and write. Therefore, good vocabulary mastery is a significant part of effective language communication. In addition, a good teaching technique can make students understand and enjoy learning English as a second language. This research aimed to determine the significant difference in vocabulary mastery between students who were taught by using children short story and those taught by using an English textbook at MAN 1 Nganjuk.

This research was a quasi-experimental design with the treatment held in four meetings, 2 x 30 minutes for each class. This design used pre-test and post-test to determine students’ vocabulary mastery. The experimental class gave a treatment by using children short story and the control class was taught as usual using their English textbook. This research's population was the tenth grade students of MAN 1 Nganjuk. Samples took two classes. One class was an experimental class was X MIPA 1 with 30 students and the control class was X MIPA 2 with 30 students. In collecting the data, the researcher used pre-test and post-test as instrument. The instruments consisted of 25 questions. It divided into two forms: complete the sentences and find out the synonym and antonym. After giving the post-test, the researcher analyzed the data using SPSS 25.00.

Based on the ANCOVA result. It can see that the result of a significant value 0.000 is smaller than 0.005 ($0.000 < 0.005$). Moreover, based on the analysis the distribution of post-test result from both group showed normal distribution. The distribution of post-test result from the experimental group showed $p (0.152) > \alpha (0.05)$ and $p (0.189) > \alpha (0.05)$ for the control group. Homogeneity assuming a variation of two groups showed the homogeneous result. Lavene’s test result showed a significant value with the result of $\text{Sig } p (0.874) > \alpha (0.05)$. Therefore, it verified that the variance of both experimental and control group is equal or homogenous across group ($0.874 > 0.05$). The result of the hypothesis test showed that $p (0.00) < \alpha (0.05)$. According to the findings above, it concluded that there was a significant difference between students taught by using children short story and students taught by using an English textbook at MAN 1 Nganjuk.

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
