## **CHAPTER V**

## A. Conclusions

This thesis analyzes illocutionary act in King Charles III's first speech as King of England and the commonwealth countries. The context of the utterance is performed, and the interpretation of speech act achieved from understanding the context. In this research uses qualitative-descriptive method.

The researcher found 43 utterances in King Charles III's first speech as King of England and the commonwealth countries. As the result, the researcher found four types of illocutionary acts. Those are assertive, commisive, expressive and declaration.
