

## CHAPTER V

### CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter contains the conclusion of the research and suggestion. The conclusion consists of the main points of the analysis and findings, which is the answer to the research question in chapter one. Then the suggestion contains other ideas concerning the next research focused on figurative language, which may be conducted by another researcher.

#### A. Conclusion

This study investigated the figurative language used in *Harry's House* album by Harry Styles. Furthermore, this study also tried to find the most dominant figurative language in *Harry's House* album by Harry Styles. The result of the data analysis showed that there are ten types of Figurative Language refers to Kennedy's Theory. They are Personification, Simile, Metaphor, Hyperbole, Paradox, Irony, Metonymy, Synecdoche, symbolism, and Allusion.

Moreover, the most dominant figurative language was metaphor, with the number of percentages 47,61% (n=30), followed by metonymy 12,69% (n=8), hyperbole 12,69% (n=8), symbolism 9,52% (n=6), paradox 6,34% (n=4), personification 3,17% (n=2), allusion 3,17% (n=2), simile 1,58% (n=1), irony 1,58% (n=1), and synecdoche 1,58% (n=1). The variety of figurative language in *Harry's House* album by Harry Styles is quite varied. There were ten types of figurative language of 12 kinds of figurative language used in *Harry's House* album by Harry Styles. This result was probably caused by the type of songs that he wrote.

## B. Suggestion

From this research, students can learn more about figurative language material to improve their analytical skills, especially through song lyrics. Songs make it easier for students to learn related material in English, where they can choose what kind of songs to apply in practice by more closely examining the figurative language in each song.

For the teacher, this research can help them understand the definition of each figure of speech, understand the use of figurative language in song lyrics, and be their guide to identifying figurative language easily. so that from these guides, teachers can ask and help their students practice more closely examining the figurative language in each song lyric, which can improve their abilities in analyzing.

For researchers, this research can contribute to the scope of English, especially for the Department of English in Literature. In addition, this research still needs to be expanded because it only includes figurative language found in *Harry's House* by Harry Styles' album without further research implications. It suggested that future researchers should also focus on the elements of other people's songs, not only figurative language but also the meaning of the whole song.
